

Child Sexual Abuse in Ireland



3,926 of TUSLA primary referrals were for sexual abuse in 2022.

There is some debate over whether it is One in Four or One in Five, that are abused.

The question we ask often is, "How many go unreported?"

• Child:

Feelings of shame and guilt. Feeling unsafe

- Family: Parents question ability to parent Unsure how to respond
- Impacts short and long term:

Up to 90% of abuse victims can develop some form of mental illness by age 18

Suicidal ideation and self-harm is significant amongst people who have been abused

Physical health, relationship, substance abuse, violent and criminal behaviors.

THERAPY HELPS:





• Regulates and emotional release.

- Communication- learn to talk about the hard to talk about thing, verbalize feelings.
- Most importantly it helps heal hurt, stop's silence and gives a voice.




CARI Challenges:

- Fundraising challenges topic/ covid/profile/cost of living



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












Passenger journeys broadly recovered across Intercity DART & Commuter areas still recovering as a result of ongoing hybrid working



Project Ireland 2040



- Protect investment in existing inter-urban rail network
- A feasibility study of high speed rail between Dublin Belfast, Dublin Limerick Junction/Cork and an evaluation of its economic benefits against improvements to existing line speeds will also be carried out against relevant appraisal processes and value-for-money tests required under the Public Spending Code to commence within a year.




Ministers welcome EU funding for transport projects in Ireland


Irish Rail has been awarded €2.5 million for supporting studies for the development of a rail freight system connecting Ireland's busiest seaports and establishing transfer points for freight between rail and road





- Overhaul of Port Safety & Asset Management systems
- Over 36 Direct Services per week to EU 30 of which carry passengers
- Only port in Ireland with served by the three largest RoRo shipping companies
- Largest ever investment in the port underway Port master plan / T7 project, Land acquisition, People and equipment €200m+ investment
- Port digitisation to create Europe's smartest port
- Winner of European Ferry Port of the Year 2023 A first for any port in Ireland
- Destined to be the 1st port to serve the ORE industry with a €220m investment







- Through People & by recognising that we needed to recruit for expansion
 - Did a 7/10 year lookahead.
 - o Identified the growing skills requirements due to expansion projects
 - $\circ~$ Looked at where the specialised skills could be recruited from
 - Identified the impending loss of corporate knowledge
 - Built a Talent Development team
